

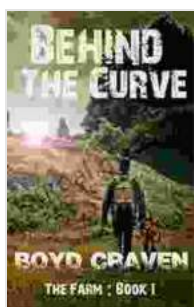
Behind the Curve: The Farm

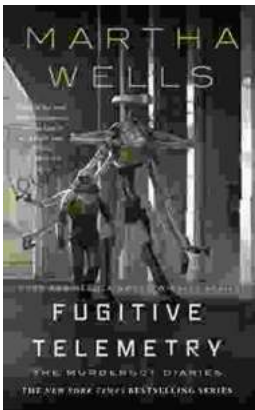
